What an outstanding year we experienced in 2022! As I say year after year, it's an exciting time to be a part of Wings! Please accept my heartfelt "Thank You" to every volunteer and donor who pours passion, time, talent, and treasure into the Wings mission.

Lives are changed daily through your gracious impact. Wings Members find a safe and secure full-time program for social and vocational training. Their lives are purpose-filled through our 22 programs. We couldn't do it without you and quite frankly, we wouldn't exist.

We served 78 Members five days a week in 2022 through our Day Program and 93 in our Social Club monthly dinner and dance. Their families are changed too knowing their Member is living out their best life and reaching greater independence. The most amazing accomplishment is our program model of cross-collaboration. Our Members served nearly 45,000 individuals suffering from food insecurity, homelessness, abuse, and incarceration through food and hygiene kits, and blankets they hand make. Our partnerships with over 70 community nonprofits is a win, win, win! Our Members find meaning through serving others and are learning vocational skills in the midst. Our donors are making a double impact on Wings Members' lives and those receiving direct services from our partners. And I must mention, the thousands and thousands of hours our Members serve each year at our ten nonprofit partners who open their doors daily for Wings to volunteer and make a difference for the souls they serve.

Services are few, our waiting list continues to grow, our space is maxed out, yet our staff continues to collaborate and find new ways to reduce our waiting list. I'm excited to announce we launched a new program in September called Wings Community Outreach, which has allowed us to reduce our waitlist by another ten members. Through this new program, our Members are serving even more folks with direct needs and stretching their abilities to new heights. We accomplish this through three offerings:



Day Program (p 6), which provides nearly 2,500 hours of programming per week and includes a significant community service investment (p 8).



Social Club, a themed monthly dinner and dance for adults with developmental disabilities (p 10).



Residential Program, currently under construction and expected to open in December 2024 (p 11).

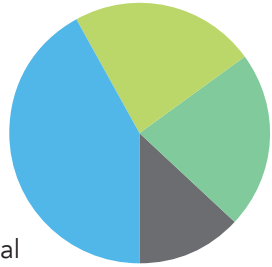


Our Members

Through our Day Program, 78 Members find purpose and meaning while learning life-skills and vocational training. They grow, learn, and try new things with their friends and community by their side.

Art Production

Members create artwork in mediums such as painting and pottery as they explore their unique talents and self expression. Our Members share their creativity with others by using their art to produce thank you cards and notes of encouragement for our volunteers, community helpers, and donors, and by donating original work to non-profit fundraisers.

Health & Fitness

Our Members participate in a variety of physical activities to help with balance, low muscle tone, and weight management, including yoga, aerobic dance, walking, riding adaptive bikes, pickleball, and cardio-drumming. Wings also partners with local organizations like Ball Golf, Edmond Center Court, and the OKC Ballet to provide special wellness opportunities.

Computer & Tech

Members learn to operate an iPad, improve keyboard skills, and use search engines to research topics to share with family and friends via e-mail, all of which is especially helpful for our nonverbal Members. Members also learn to use iPads for photography and videography and apply these skills to create short films while working as a team.

Transition Living

Operating out of a studio apartment setting, this program allows Members to learn and practice daily living skills like cleaning, budgeting, and social skills. By meeting members where they are, the Transition Living program helps them move to the next level of independence in their adult lives, which is one of our primary goals as an organization.

Chapel

Every week, area churches and partners come to the Wings campus to lead Members in praise and worship, Bible lessons, and prayer time. Chapel is a time for our Members to deepen their relationship with their Lord and Savior, who loves them unconditionally, all while supporting their community of friends and family through prayer.

Culinary

Our Members learn healthy eating and lifestyle habits as they shop for groceries, learn to follow recipes, and make simple meals and snacks independently. Members also learn to make gourmet dog and cat treats to donate to local animal shelters, and frozen meals for individuals in need at Reaching Our City.

Wings in the Community

As part of our Day Program, Members volunteer in the community through three unique programs:

Spreading Our Wings

One of the Day Program opportunities, Spreading Our Wings, sends our Members out into their community volunteering in our non-profit partners' spaces. They serve our partners by stocking food pantry shelves, packaging food kits, organizing baby donations, and stocking classrooms and church pews.

Community Outreach

Launched in 2022, Wings Community Outreach is a way for our Members to fill the gaps of our non-profit partners' programming through volunteerism. In this program, Members make blankets for infants in need, dog toys for animals in shelters, sleeping mats for the homeless, and more for Wings partners.

Wings Serves OK

Wings Serves OK helps our Members take an active role in fulfilling the needs of our community. Members serve by assembling individual hygiene kits to donate to local non-profits aiding the homeless, children in foster care, families suffering from low income, and the incarcerated. Members also serve by assembling emergency food kits for the clients of our non-profit partner, Palomar.

Our partnership with Wings helps us to reach the needs of our clients who come to us from a multitude of challenging scenarios. This program is such a blessing to our organization and our community of survivors, who face crisis ranging from domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, child abuse, and elder abuse.

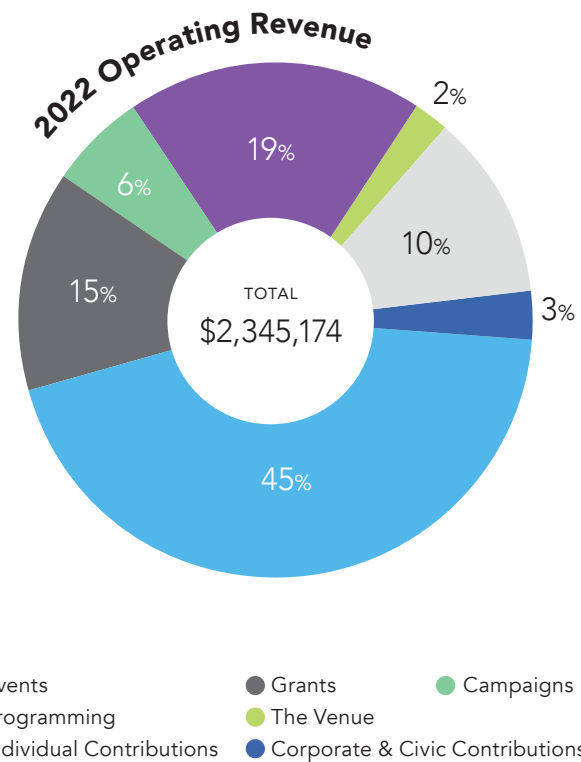

Wings volunteer Betty Bohan and Wings Member Hannah Jensen originally met 20 years ago through Hannah's Promise, a program offered through the Church of the Servant that provided respite for parents who have children with developmental disabilities. Betty and Hannah formed a significant bond, but when the pandemic shut Hannah's Promise down, they lost touch.

Betty took a break from volunteer work to focus on her health while she battled COVID and breast cancer, but once she was on the mend, she knew she was ready to jump in again. She started researching opportunities and landed on Wings, unaware that her old friend had since graduated high school and joined Wings as a Member.

At the 2022 Wings Fall Festival, Hannah spotted a familiar face through the window of the pumpkin train, and ran straight from the train into Betty's unsuspecting arms. Betty instantly knew she had found the right place to give back her time, and we are grateful to have her as a volunteer with Wings.

Wings was created to serve, and this reunion tells the story of the many lives we have the privilege of impacting. Betty found a place that she can give back and build meaningful relationships with Members just like Hannah. Hannah found a place of belonging and a sense of purpose through the programming Wings provides, and Hannah's parents John and Tammy Jensen have found a safe, enriching, and fulfilling place for their daughter!

"Wings does not treat Hannah like a child, like many others," Hannah's mom Tammy Jensen said. "They challenge her and she has exceeded all our expectations. That is everything we hoped for."
